I am writing to certain add's that I have seen of late regarding the Remington Arms line of rifles and certain points that I feel are misleading regarding those same add's. First off let me say that I am and have long been a Remington Access-Fan. At the present time I own four of your fine rifles and within the exception of one of those rifles have nothing but good things to say about them.

The one exception is my latest addition to my gun group and that rifle is a left hand model 700 BDL in 370 caliber that my wife bought me as a graduation present last May. This is the same rifle that your add's portray as one of strength and built at soldiers because of this strength. Being an avid hunter (300 days a year in the mountains when I'm hunting) it was particularly pleased to receive this rifle and spent much of my summer preparing it for the fall elk, deer, and hunting season. As far as accuracy, design, and excellent I am and would not disappointed in this new rifle. I eagerly waited for the opening day of elk hunting season.

The first three days of elk season brought some new and disturbing facts concerning this rifle to light. The disturbing news was that the bolt on the 370 does not lock down as my other rifles bolts do. This fact
