RE: Remington Model 600 Malfunction of Sufety Mechanism

Dar Mr. Sienkiewicz:

I cam a Remington Model 600 in a 6MM caliber. The social number of this rifle is 92537. This is an early Model 600 and I have had many years of enjoyable hunting with this gun. A couple of years ago, while doer hunting in Fredricksburg, Texas, the gun discharged when I put the safety mechanism into the firing position. I am sure you are quito familiar with this problem because of the well publicised lawsuit which Remington lost over a similar incident in which a hunter was seriously injured.

Luckily, being a safe hunter and knowing the proper cure and usage of a firearm, the shot went straight up into the trees above me. This incident puzzled me, and I thought that possibly the trigger had caught on something. However, when I talked with some of my relatives, namely Thomas h. Jackson and helpert A. Klein, who have the same gun in 243 caliber, they had similar incidents happen to them.

As Mr. Jackson had written in a previous letter dated February 8, 1962, we took our rifles to be repaired at a certain sperting goods store. They were returned to us with the understanding that they had repaired the problem at no charme.

In the last funting season, I let my fiancee use this gun. After the hunt, my liancee was unloading the gun, and as she put the safety forward to unlock the bolt, the gun dischargel. The shot blow a hole in the dirt makes from my father's feet. The unexpected direcharge also severely bruized my fiancee's hand and arm. On the summ hunt, my uncle sobert A. Klein, shot a hole through his Jeep CJ7 when he just the safety mechanism forward.
