I checked the mechanism 4-5 times after that with no shell and it dropped the pin everytime I released satter - then after that it worked properly. It was about 20°F and didn't know if factory had heavy oil that would affect it or what.

Anyway, I have always had Winchester but loved the feel of this gun but I don't and will never again trust this particular rifle. I would either like a brand new tested unit or my money refunded. We normally never chamber shells until last minute but felt the situation warranted it. The danger of
