The above named patient received an accidental gunshot wound to the tip of his right great toe on 11/29/84. There was partial loss of the distal phalanx and a shattering of the nailbed and much deformity of the end of the toe. A formal re-amputation was carried out in the office under toe block, this including the entire distal phalanx, and a long plantar flap was formed for the formation of the amputation. He will probably be off work in a special orthopedic shoe at home elevating his foot for at least two weeks and may be able to start back to light office work on 12/17/84.
