

been adjusted; some had not. Fortunately, there were no personal injuries involved although there was property damage. Many of these same hunters reload their own shells. As a result, if the shell fits in a little tight it could cause a stiff bolt. The extra pressure required to open a stiff bolt could result in another accidental discharge.

Approximately a year ago I purchased a Remington 700 and I am now wondering whether or not I have a safe gun. Is it not possible to design a gun in which the safety does not have to be released in order to open the bolt? I know that some other companies have this feature.

I would be quite willing to have a representative of your company come to my home to inspect some of the guns involved and to speak with the gunsmith involved. My only interest in this matter is making you aware of the fact that there appears to be a problem with this gun. I don't want what happened to me to happen to anyone else.
