All Model 600 series rifles made prior to 1975, which includes your rifle, were recalled for replacement of the trigger mechanism. This recall began in 1978, and used direct contact with retailers, such as Chandler's, and very widespread advertisements in gun and hunting magazines.

We need to examine your rifle to determine the cause of the difficulty you experienced, and of course, we would like to replace the trigger mechanism (fire control) at no-charge, as consistent with our recall program for this model.
