
DEAR SIR:

RECENTLY ON A CBS-TV 60 MINUTES SEGMENT I WATCHED THE  
SEGMENT ON FIREARM SAFETY. ONE OF THE WEAPONS DISCUSSED  
WAS THE REMINGTON MODEL 700, PRIOR TO 1975.

IN 1983 I BOUGHT A SECOND HAND 700 BDL, 22/250 CAL.,  
SERIAL NO. 321698; WHICH I STILL HAVE AND RARELY HAVE USED.  
AFTER THIS SEGMENT I REMOVED THE WEAPON FROM THE GUN CASE  
AND WORKED THE BOLT AND SAFETY MANY TIMES. ON ONE INSTANCE  
I MOVED THE SAFETY TO THE FIRE POSITION AND THE GUN WENT  
OFF. I SHOULD MENTION THE WEAPON WAS UNLOADED AT THE TIME.

TO MY KNOWLEDGE THIS IS THE FIRST TIME THIS HAS  
HAPPENED SINCE I PURCHASED THE RIFLE. WHAT SUGGESTION CAN  
YOU GIVE ME TO MAKE THIS WEAPON SAFE FOR USE?
