I recently purchased a Remington model 788 - 243 cal. rifle with 4x32- scope for my twelve year old son. I am pleased with the rifle in every way except for the safety and its position on the stock. It seems that whenever my son is carrying the rifle, the weight of it has a tendency to cause the rifle to roll back against his right hand thumb knuckle, and thus releasing the safety without his realizing it! At first I thought maybe it was because the barrel was too small and he held the stock in such a manner that the knuckle protruded up and in front of the safety. I tried carrying the rifle myself, walking through brush, etc. and the same thing happened to me over and over again! I cannot let him use the rifle because of this, and
