We were indeed sorry to learn of his having a problem of any kind with one of our products.

The recall that Remington made nine (9) years ago was for the Model 600 and 660. The Model 700 rifle does not have a like problem and has never been recalled.

Generally, the type of problem you described results from either improper adjustment of the trigger assembly outside our factory, from improper maintenance of the rifle, or from accidental contact with the trigger when the safety is in the "fire" position.

If you desire, we would gladly examine the rifle to insure proper operating condition. If you wish, return the rifle via U.P.S. insured to:
