I purchased this rifle for my wife for the purpose of big game hunting several years ago. We have gone hunting with the rifle twice in two consecutive years and on both occasions have had spontaneous discharges of the rifle when either the bolt was closed on a live round or the safety was moved to "fire"! Fortunately, there were no injuries but we were both shocked and very apprehensive to handle the rifle. Subsequently, we put the rifle away, not to be handled again. We considered selling the rifle but our conscious would not allow the possibility of someone else being injured or killed!

After watching the nationally aired episode of 60 Minutes, our situation became shockingly familiar. We believe this rifle is indeed one of these early Model 700 rifles which are defective.


We respectfully request that this rifle be returned in exchange for a current model or accepted as partial credit towards a new rifle. We were informed that Remington may have established some form of program to resolve this issue with these defective and very dangerous rifles.

We do not want this rifle back or repaired!! We are scared to death of it!!

Our legal counsel informed us that due to Remingtons settlement with the gentleman which was injured as mentioned on 60 Minutes, legal precedent has been established and some form of adjustment or exchange for this defective firearm is in order.
