I am returning my 30.06 to Remington Arms to your attention as we discussed on the phone on 8/22/94.

While sighting in a new scope I placed a shell in the chamber with the safety on. As I closed the bolt the rifle fired voluntary. My wife was beside me with the spotting scope; it scared the hell out of both of us and we were both puzzled at the time. Sometime later we saw the "60 Minutes" piece on the model 700 bolt action and became quite concerned.

I contacted my local gunsmith but he did not have an answer. I waited until the Atlanta Buckarama and saw the Remington representative who referred me to the Dorns Gun Service in Macon, Georgia a Remington Warranty Service Representative. Mr. Dorn suggested I contact the factory.
