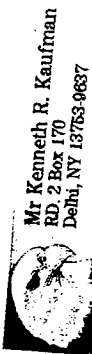

I have a Remington Model 788 that I purchased in 1970. I use it mostly for deer hunting. This last deer season I loaded the gun, put the safety on and the gun fired. After that it worked fine for the remainder of the deer season. In January 1994 I took the gun out again to go varmint hunting and it happened again. I took the gun to a gunsmith and he said the gun acted like the oil in the action had hardened and when the gun was stored for a period of time it made the gun fire when the safety was put on. He took the gun apart and cleaned it. That solved the problem. Perhaps something should be in your instructions that this can happen. Because I was taught that you don't point a gun at anything you don't want to shoot, no harm was done.
