Would you please take care of this problem so that it won't happen again. My wife likes the gun and I would hate to have an unsafe gun on my hands. Also, I will be incurring additional costs for shipping, telephone calls, gunsmith to remount scope (hopefully not), ammunition to resight in the gun, cleaning supplies, and not to mention my time. Pleas let me know what I need to do to recover these expenses. I know Remington does not want an unsafe gun out there and is hopefully going to do what is necessary to take care of the problem and have a satisfied and safe customer on their hands.
