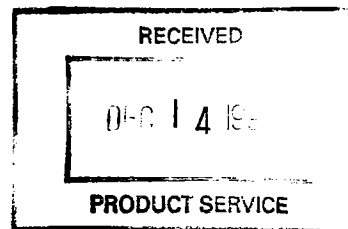

Dear Remington,


Last October, my Model 700 - 300 mag misfired while Elk hunting in Colorado.

The rifle discharged as I pushed the safety from "SAFE" to the "FIRE" position. Fortunately, the barrel was pointed up and away from the other hunters with me. The only injury was a cut to my right thumb where the safety jammed into it on discharge.

I took it to a gunsmith to have it checked out and was told that this type of misfire incident was not uncommon to the Model 700. He gave me the attached article to read that describes exactly how my rifle discharged, and advised me not to use it anymore, because he could not guarantee that it would not happen again.

I have hunted with it twice since then and, frankly, am not comfortable with handling it. It's a beautiful rifle and I would hate not to hunt with it, but it's not worth risking another misfire. I don't know if Remington has had any type of recall program in effect regarding incidents such as this, but I felt that, as the manufacturer, you should be made aware of a safety device failure that could have been catastrophic.
