Enclosed please fine a Model 700 BDL 270 cal. rifle. I would like you to please check the trigger mechanism and safety for malfunction.

The history of malfunction is as follows. In early August my 30 year old daughter and I were sighting in this rifle after a scope change. We had fired approximately 20 rounds when the rifle fired when the bolt was closed. My daughter, who was shooting at the time, is a very accomplished handler of firearms. She took a firearms safety class while still in grade school, and has hunted with me since she has been old enough to handle a gun. She was convinced her fingers were no where near the trigger. I dismantled the gun to check if there dirt in the trigger mechanism. It appeared to be clean.

I ran hundreds of shells through the mechanism, and ran it through with no ammo many times also with no malfunction. Convinced that the malfunction was an aberration, we took the rifle on Caribou hunting trip. Because of the malfunction, my daughter was very caution about having a live round in the chamber. We were in the final stage of a stalk of a small herd of Caribou when Bobbi said she was going to check the chamber to be sure she had it loaded. Then she took the safety off, it discharged again. Again, she was convinced nothing was touching the trigger.

Needless to say, I have lost confidence in the gun! I do not want to sell it. I would feel responsible if someone got hurt. I would like you to check it out, and fix whatever needs repair.

I am a very large Remington fan, and have been very satisfied with there performance for over 30 years. I own two 870's a 20 Ga and a .410. Both of my daughters learned to shoot with a Rem. 788 .223, and Bobbi actually killed a Caribou with it as a young teen. I also own a Rem XP-100 221 Fireball which if a delightful pistel. Along with this .270, my main hunting firearm is a Mod 700 300 Win Mag. which I have owned and used for ower 30 years. It has been also and very faithful hunting companion. Remingtons have served me well, and I hope they will continue long into the future.

As I said before, please do whatever is needed to fix this problem. A gun that can't be trusted is a very expensive of the same of the sam
