Presume guns were shipped

In accordance with Technical Planning Committee Minutes dated February 12, 1942, we are forwarding to you two (2) M/720 Rifles; No. 41301 represents the present quality of stock finish, and Rifle No. 41457 is a sample of the proposed quality of stock finish.

The method of finishing these two (2) rifles differs in that the present process is to hand sand, fill, and lacquer finish two coats. The proposed method of finishing was performed by hand sanding, fill, lacquer finish one coat, hand sand, and then lacquer finish two additional coats.

The additional cost per each to obtain this finish is estimated as follows:
