Of the six rifle safeties and six shotgun safeties offered the respondents for their consideration, four are identical. These are

> Cross bolt - front of trigger guard, Cross bolt - rear of trigger guard, Sliding catch on small of grip, Grip safety.

These four safeties received 89.2% of the "preference votes" of the shotgun respondents.

The degree to which sportsmen who are interested in both a rifle and a shotgun desire the same safety on each is shown in the following table:
