SUBJECT: ESTIMATED MANUFACTURING COST MODEL 721 RIFLE .222 CALIBER
ESTIMATE #CFR-17

Per request we have prepared a high spot cost estimate of material and labor to manufacture the Model 721 rifle in .222 caliber. M. H. Walker furnished information as to those parts which differ from Standard A grade and are as follows:

- * The normal year forecast production of the .222 caliber rifle is 1000. Therefore, it is questionable whether these components comparable to the standard rifle can be purchased at same cost. To cover this possibility and also the lack of a complete design picture, the safety factor is shown unusually high.
