M/851 MACHINES BORROWED FOR TEMPORARY USE ON M/721 GUN PRODUCTION

This letter will confirm a recent conversation between the writer and Jack Brand and between Jack Brand and yourself relative to borrowing one of the Plain 2-24 Cincinnati Millers recently received for M/851 production.

Is is requested that this Plain 2-24 Miller be made available for immediate use on the M/721 gun with the understanding that it is to be released when required for use on the M/851. It is believed that this machine can be put to immediate use for a period of two or three months.

As a matter of record, one 2-24 Rise and Fall and two 1-18 Cincinnati Millers have already been borrowed from the M/851 line on this same basis. These machines are located in 46-1 at the present time and may be identified as follows:

1-18 Cincinnati Miller, serial no 2F1P1S-14; no plant inventory #

2-24 Rise & Fall, serial no 1B5P1S-15; plant inventory #22025

1-18 Cincinnati Miller, serial no. 2F1P1S-17; no plant inventory #

It is also requested that in the event the Plain 2-24 Cincinnati Miller is moved to building 45-1 it be accompanied by a check list of accessories, tools and etc; which must accompany the machine when it is returned to your control. This has not been done in the case of three machines in the M/851 line already borrowed.
