There is only one thing that we don't like about the gun and that is the Safety. Many times we have been walking through the wood and find the safety being on the red, ready to fire. We use these guns all summer for foxes and coyotes.

I have talked to quite a few, and they seem to have the same trouble; they ~~safety~~ safety shifting over to the firing mark and, to me, I don't like it too much as I think it is very dangerous. I do my own loading and go through about 300 rounds every summer killing woodchucks and crows. The safety goes on firing way too easy to suit me.

I'm just telling you this, because I have heard quite a few fellows tell me the same thing. It seems that your engineers working on improving these guns could think of some way that this safety could be improved.

I own two shotguns, Remingtons, and a 22 and find the safety on these guns very fine.
