With decision to hold up on the Model XR-8 Rolling Block pending a new rim fire line review, this has some significant effect on Mike's load normally assigned to firearms.

There were some changes for M/700 such as longer length barrels for the larger calibers, and also picking up the new Win. Caliber 30 Mag. cartridge.

Wayne has also asked Mike to help in the application of new 35 Rem. short Magnum for the M/600, and in addition to take over the M14 Rim Fire Simulator job which the Govt. seems determined that we continue. A new project letter has been issued.
