and publicity. These barrels ordinarily increase the retail price of a center fire rifle by \$10,00. Since we have already shipped approximately 1,000 of the rifles which are new in trade or communar hands, and since an increase in price would create a Fair Trade enforcement problem, no price revision is anticipated until January 1, 1964.

6. Ilion will advise the Sales Pepartment concerning the date when replacements will be available, on two schedules:

Sobscule 1: Immediate replacement of occasional guns individual oustoner complaints, and

Schedule 2: Replacement of inventory to resume shipment on the orders already on hand but held up.

The foregoing procedures were decided upon by the group to prevent unfavorable publicity, prevent a general return of Model 700 and Model 742 rifles in 6 mm. caliber, and to assure a minimum of cost absorption on product replacement.
