Would you please give me your opinion concerning the installation of a 40XB standard trigger (not the 202 trigger) in a Rem 700 BDH. 22-250 cal.

With the current factory trigger in my 700, I am unable to adjust it to a one pound pull (approx) I wrote to Remington Arms about installing a 40XB trigger in the 700. Their answer (inclosed) seems to indicate that they would not recommend it. Still, they sent me a parts brochure for the 40XB. (?)

A gunsmith told me that the 40XB trigger would not fit in the 700 action. And that any trigger (in the 700), adjusted to a one pound pull, would create a change of the gun discharging when the bolt is closed. Yet, another gunsmith told me there would be no problem at all.
