


strictly only short range chucks, mostly

Would you please give me your opinion
concerning the installation of a 40XB standard
trigger (not the 20Z. trigger) in a Rem 700 BDH.
22-250 cal.

With the current factory trigger in
my 700, I am unable to adjust it to a one
pound pull (approx.) I wrote to Remington Arms
about installing a 40XB trigger in the 700.
Their answer (inclined) seems to indicate that they
wouldn't recommend it. Still, they sent me a
parts checkup for the 40XB. (?)

It seems they told me that the 40XB trigger
would not fit in the 700 action. And that any
trigger (on the 700), adjusted to a one pound pull,
would create a change of the gun discharging
when the bolt is closed. Yet another gunsmith
told me this would be no problem at all.
