## INTRODUCTION:

Mr. Alexander Gadbois complained about the occurrence of stock warpage downward away from barrel during shooting and requested corrective action instructions to relieve this stock warpage.

## OBJECT:

The Test Lab investigated this customer complaint checking for stock warpage and related effect on accuracy. The test guns were Production XP 100 pistols ready for packing.

## CONCLUSION:

1. Shooting the XP 100 pistol produces stock warpage. The stock warps downward away from the barrel.
2. The XP 100 pistol shooting for point of impact indicated a shift downward of point of impact during the XP 100 accuracy testing.
