TRIP REPORT  
AUGUST SILHOUETTE MATCH - PENN STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

The M/700 308 Varmint's popularity continues as more first-time shooters appear at these matches with them. These shooters are using these guns, for the most part, as purchased. And with little or no modification. All that seems to be done is the adjusting of the triggers to lighten them.

The writer talked with an individual who had bought his rifle the 8th of August, shot it for the first time on the 13th of August, and was a competitor on the 14th. This is the exception rather than the rule but can be taken as a good indication of this product's acceptance. Remington continues to dominate this sport with the competitors using mostly Remington rifles or actions.

An area of concern for Remington could be the desire for, but lack of, loading components. Questions were asked whether we still make cases for the 280 Remington. A second question was, do we plan to come out with a 7m/m or 280 Rem Varmint.

This match consisted of 102 participants including two women. High score for the shoot was a 24 in Class AAA. Weather was not favorable but did not affect the ability of the top shooters, as the scores will show.
