

Voice Analyzers Register Deception

n investigating officer has completed interviews with five alleged witnesses to an armed robbery. His questions and the witnesses' answers were recorded on a small, hand-held cassette tape recorder operated by the investigating officer. Later, the tapes are replayed through a small desk top unit while the officer observes a digital readout and records the figures generated by the witnesses' responses. These figures on the readout indicate the degree of stress in each response. Consequently, within minutes, the officer can determine not only that three of the five witnesses are reliable, but also that they are able to provide a more positive description of the robbery suspect. Closing the case will still involve a lot of good police work...but the officer has a running start because he has availed himself of a new, electronic instrument.

The above situation is only one police application for a new generation of voice analyzers presently being marketed. The unit described is the MARK I Voice Analyzer now offered through Crawford International of Washington, D.C.

After ten years of intensive research, development and rigorous field testing, the MARK I & II Voice Analyzers are in use not only with law enforcement agencies, but also with personnel directors, lawyers, psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, and various government agencies.

The MARK I & II Voice Analyzers electronically process speech and instantaneously provide a numerical value of the stress level of the speaker. Because there is no physical contact or attachment to the speaker, they prove highly versatile in application to detect deception. They perform

New Security System Pinpoints Crime Scene

A new security system, designed primarily for schools, apartments, offices, and other compartmentalized structures, has recently been announced by Mentoris Company of California. Designated the Silent Communications and Alarm Network (SCAN), this system has the capability to indicate the precise location of an incident.

SCAN contains three basic units: a transmitter, wall or ceiling mounted receivers, and a master control panel.

The transmitter is a small penlike device which can be carried in a pocket or purse. When activated, it causes a springloaded plunger to strike a resonant bar, thereby generating a silent ultrasonic signal. The signal is picked up by the nearest receiver which lights up, indicating that it has functioned. The receiver then relays this information to a corresponding light on the central control panel. The light on the control panel is keyed to the location of the receiver, which enables the person monitoring the alarm to dispatch security personnel closest to the scene.

An individual operating the transmitter may trigger the silent alarm when in proximity to any of the receiver stations throughout the building with little or no indications to an aggressor that a call for help has been made. This alarm system is useful not only in guarding against unauthorized persons entering the protected structure, but also for summoning aid in case of accidents or other emergencies.

Lubricani Developed For. Missiles Available For Firearms

ESprayon Products, Inc., Bed-Bord Heights, Ohio, has recently REGISTERED with the Police Weapons Center an aerosol corrosion-preventative lubricant known as # 717 Penetrant-Ender Penetrant. This product was specifically developed for use on guided missiles in conjunction with the Naval Ordnance Systems Command and assigned Weapon Specification 14138.

7/1 offers a clear invisible film that displaces moisture rapidly from metal surfaces and deposits a greaseless barrier coat which cleans and resists collections of dirt and foreign particles. Although well suited to lubricate and prevent corrosion in firearms, caution should be taken to remove all cartridges from the firearm prior to applying = 7/1. Excess material should always be wiped free from the chamber.

This lubricant will not affect plastic, rubber, fabrics, or

painted surfaces and does not contain silicone. It has successfully passed accelerated laboratory conditions of humidity, salt spray, and water displacement.
