SUBJECT: APRIL MONTHLY REPORT

Metallurgical support this month has shifted from O/U priorities (almost total focus last six months) to the normal mix of R&D projects and general plant assistance.

- 1. We are qualifying an upset 416R stainless steel for Model 700's.
- Project 70 material for breech bolts has been specified and ordered.
- 3. Review and release Model 7 engineering documentation.
- Andy Baszczuk reviewed pilgering documentation for metallurgical detailing.

Plant Assistance - O/U braze of barrels and mono-bloc is very close to qualifying for lot sample x-ray analysis. Electrical resistance welding of O/U vent ribs was evaluated to improve stress relief treatment.

Litigation - I attended the Cole v Remington trial as a reserve witness, since the only declared technical witness was one of the plaintiffs on metallurgy. A jury verdict for Remington was returned after a one-hour jury deliberation on the third day of trial. A busy deposition schedule is anticipated during May and June.

General - The April TECH BRIEF was presented by David Findlay
entitled, 'Viper: Cycle of Operations'.
