FLAT RECEIVER TRANSFER LINE

Most of my time has been spent preparing information regarding the proposed transfer line. I am almost finished with the illustrations of the operations needed for each model of receiver, and have been preparing a written description as well. On Wednesday the 15th, I was at a tool show in Rochester learning more about possible transfer line manufacturers and their machinery. I have met with representatives from several of these companies to introduce to them our requirements for this transfer line.

"B-S-T" STAMPING ON PEERLESS

I have placed an order for a new stamp holder and stamps to imprint the B-S-T marking along the top tang of the Peerless frame. This new stamping tool moved the B and T 0.100" closer to the S, and should eliminate the ripple that occasionally forms beneath the B and the T upon stamp impact. I expect this stamp holder to have been delivered to me by the last week in October.

ARMORERS SCHOOL

During the week of the 13th through the 17th, I was in Armorers School. During this time, I learned how to disassemble and assemble the 870 12 Ga shotgun and the 700 Rifle. My absence on the 15th (tool show) caused me to miss the instructions on the 1187, but I have been invited to attend this portion of the schooling on a later date. Through this training, I feel I have become more familiar with components of these weapons, and how they function together.

7400/7600 CONVENTIONAL RECEIVER LINE

I have been assisting Jack Fitzer solve any problems which turn up in the 7400/7600 receiver line as it is being brought back into operation.
