Thank you for contacting Remington Country. We would recommend taking the firearm to a Remington Authorized Repair Center for inspection. With what you have described, we would probably replace the trigger if the condition of your trigger is beyond cleaning or repair. The repair center can inspect it and advise whether the standard removal of the bolt lock will fix the problem or if it should be replaced and they can advise of any charges.
