## Firearm Examination Report

M/700 ADL, 30-06 Cal. Serial # 6372713 - T. Brown, Greensburg, Pennsylvania No. R number

This rifle was examined in the offices of Boyle, Nakle, Stillwagon and another, the plaintiff's attorneys, in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, on December 8, 1971.

Significant evidence found in this rifle was associated with the Trigger Engagement Screw. The stake and seal, which is applied to this screw at the factory, had been broken and bright marks were evident on the slot in the screw head indicating that adjustment had been made on the firing mechanism after the rifle had been shipped from the factory. Staking and sealing prevents the Trigger Engagement screw from turning, thereby, preventing the Sear and Connector engagement which is adjusted at the factory, from changing during use.

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These lost wages are verified per a copy of the report from Blairsville Machine Products Company, which is enclosed.

Counsel for the plaintiff made a demand of \$17,500.00 and no indication of interest whatsoever was given. We insisted that this was a case where our testimony would show the tampering must have been involved after the weapon left the factory.

In our evaluation of this file it seems apparent to us that the plaintiff will get a verdict. Without knowing at all what your approach to this particular kind of situation is, we recommend a settlement in the amount of \$10,000.00. There is no question but what the man, himself, was innocent of any wrong-doing because he was not handling the weapon. Kuncher had to be pointing the weapon toward Brown and counsel will be kept in this case, but this doesn't help in the settlement of the case.

We have received notice that a Settlement Conference will be held before Judge McCormick on Monday, April 24, at 9:00 a.m. and it will not be necessary for your or any representative from the company to be present at that time. We, however, should have your authorization if you care to make one prior to the Settlement Conference date. In addition, the case is scheduled for trial during the week of Monday, May 1. It is very far down on the list and it is difficult to say if it could be reached as scheduled, but could come up Wednesday or Thursday of that week, and we will have to be prepared to proceed at that time. If not reached as scheduled, it would then be placed on a special list ofr Monday, May 22. As soon as anything more definite can be passed on to you, we will promptly do so. We would appreciate knowing your reaction to the demand.
