COMPARISON OF M/S70 "SC" & "TC" GUNS

In accordance with your request, a review has been made of the subject shotguns from the standpoint of major points of difference between the two items.

The major differences are as follows:

A. Stock

1. "TC"'s are fitted with a recoilpad - "SC"'s are not .
2. "TC"'s are manufactured to customer's specifications for length without extra charge - "SC"'s are not.
3. "TC"'s are hand-shaped, hand-sanded and fitted to a greater extent than are "SC"'s.
4. "TC"'s have a hand-rubbed varnish finish versus a four coat lacquer finish on "SC"'s.
5. "TC"'s have more expensive grip cap than that used on "SC"'s.

B. Fore End

1. "TC"'s have a varnish finish versus lacquer on "SC"'s.

C. Fire Control

1. Special sears and hammers are specified for "TC"'s but not for "SC"'s.
2. Action bar locks are given special fitting on "TC"'s, but not on "SC"'s.

D. Packing

1. Special packing material is used in packing "TC" guns that is not used on "SC" guns.

The total difference in Factory Cost between "TC" and "SC" guns runs around \$23.00 each.

The additional hand work, recoil pad, varnish finish, etc., on "TC" Stocks and Fore Ends runs around \$19.00 per gun. The additional packing materials used on "TC" guns adds about \$.70 per gun. The balance of \$3.30 per gun in additional cost is the approximate total of all other differences between the two items.
