Common Sight Line Stock - Models 740-760

The Sales Department stated that when the common stock line was proposed, they understood that, because of reduction of inventories, costs would be reduced. Since it was indicated at the last meeting that the necessity for providing a new rear sight with a raised base would lead to higher costs, they have reconsidered their former position, but still believe we will require the common sight line to retain our competitive position.

The Sales Department requested that a project be prepared. To support this project, Sales will submit a 1958 forecast of the Models 721, 722, 740, and 760, with and without the common stock. The committee agreed that this project should also include the smooth exterior contour on the barrel of the Models 721 and 722,
