

ment felt that if such a carbine was furnished in three calibers at \$112.45, sales of none of the three would be sufficient to justify introduction. Sales has therefore been requested to reconsider the possibility of introducing the 30/06 only at \$112.45. In the meantime, Research and Development will investigate briefly what would be required to introduce such a rifle.

C2 - Colored Metal and Light Wood
on Varmint Caliber Center Fire Guns

The Sales Department has indicated an interest in this proposal in caliber 222 in Model 722, 725 and 760. Since a method of coloring steel is not yet available, consideration might be given to the use of sun grain wood only. To permit further evaluation of this possibility, the Sales Department would like to see samples of the 222 Remington in Models 722, 725 and 760 with sun grain wood.

C3 - Model 721, 722 With New Sporter Stock

The Sales Department forecast an increase of 3,000 rifles with no change in selling price and with no effect on sales of the Model 725. It was hoped that the increased volume would justify the somewhat increased cost.

E. Sapp reported that the following full burden factory costs have been developed:

Present Model 721 Stock	\$7.53
Sporter Monte Carlo Stock made at Ilion	10.06
Sporter Monte Carlo Stock purchased	13.12

It is quite apparent that if these costs figures are reliable, this proposal would be economically unjustified.

It was suggested that the cheek piece might not be required and that possibly a less expensive stock having only a very high comb would be satisfactory.
