Shipment of powdered metal dies for the Front Sight is promised by November 14, 1958. Aluminum open sight leaf blanks are expected December 1, 1958.

It is still expected that new Sights will be limited for the present to the Model 572 Lightweight gun. After January 1, 1959 the Sales Department will review and possibly propose the new Sights for extension to the balance of the Rim Fire line.

S-1 - Light Colored Stocks and Fore-ends (Shotguns)

It has been proposed by the Sales Department that Sportsman-58 and Model 870 shotguns be offered in light wood, maple, stocks and fore-ends, with gold colored parts. To avoid the necessity of complete inventories of all models and specifications, it has been proposed that light wood be introduced only in four Trap and Skeet models to be known as -

Sportsman-58 SBL (Skeet Grade)
Sportsman-58 TBL (Trap Grade)
Model 870 SBL (Skeet Grade)
Model 870 TBL (Trap Grade)

and that ADL models be cataloged and offered to special order only.
