The Research & Development and Production Departments consider January, 1963 to be the earliest practical date for announcement of this item, in view of current progress. While some improvement in completion of various phases of work might be made by augmenting work force, and telescoping work phases, it could only be done with considerably increased cost and risk of poor gun performance.

The objectives to be achieved with the Model 58, 5-Shot Autoloader are defined as follows, by the Sales Department:

- Five shot capacity, five gauges, Field Trap -Skeet - Magnum types.

- 3. Improved overall appearance.
