

CENTER FIRE RIFLES - contd.Caliber 6.5mm Remington - contd.

The plant turned over forty (40) selected rifles to R & D. Release of shipment to writers has been held until a new production lot of ammunition is available. Delivery of ammunition is expected the end of April. As a result, testing and shipment to writers will be delayed until the first part of May.

MODEL 700 "BDL" VARMINT RIFLE

Model drawings have been released to the plant. Processing and tool design has started. The varmint rifle is scheduled for warehouse in November 1966. Priority is to be given to the 22 and 22-250 calibers. Announcement is January 1967.

MODEL 742 "ADL" GRADECanadian Centennial 1967

The major Canadian distributor of guns has a registered trade mark for a "Canadian Centennial Gun." The distributor has indicated an order for two thousand (2000) Model 742 "ADL" grade rifles, caliber 308 Winchester. Centennial marking of the Receiver with silver nitro-bond painting of the centennial design, "Canadian Centennial Gun", Woodmaster Model 742 and serial number (1 to 2000) is proposed. In addition, a medallion to be furnished by the distributor is to be inserted in the stock. Initial delivery of one thousand (1000) rifles in September 1966 is desired.

A higher jobber's price is proposed which would increase Remington profit.

The plant indicated that the rifle forecast for United States sales could be met. The additional rifles for Canada can also be produced. After approval of the design, delivery can start in five months.
