Riot Gun - Military Version - contd.

The Model 7180 (Model 1100) version is being re-estimated.

The expediting of the bayonet attachment program with an expenditure of \$85,000 for tooling could delay other new gun programs by one month. Everything possible is being done to reduce delays to a minimum.

Marketing reported customers are making adaptations to handle a bayonet on current guns. Information on how this is being accomplished is to be furnished R & D.

Riot Guns

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Marketing is proposing to change the designation from "Riot" to "Police." The plant is to be advised when the proposed change is to be effected.

MODEL 870, 28-410 GAUGE MODEL 1100, 20-28-410 GAUGE

R & D reported designs of the Locking Block, Barrel orifice holes, Breech Bolt and other functioning components are being released for plant processing with a minimum of design testing. R & D expects to have ten (10) models for testing by January 15, 1968, and three (3) of each of the five models by March 15, 1968. Additional model guns, some of which can be sent to the field for testing, should be completed July 15, 1968. As testing continues, there may be further changes in component design. At present, R & D is behind schedule.

There are problems of manually feeding the 410 gauge guns. Changes to the Latches, Carrier and cuts in the Receiver are being evaluated.

A prototype Model 1100, 410 gauge gun with added vents in the rib and mahogany wood for weight reduction was shown to the Committee. The weight of this gun was 6 lbs. 15.9 oz. Marketing had specified

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
