AUTOMATIC TRAPS

Enclosed is a short progress report on the Automatic Traps.

With the help of the Shooting Promotion Division and our experience at the Great Eastern in 1967, several engineering changes have been made and others initiated which indicate that an eventual service life of 60,000 eyeles is probably available without major adjustmention repair. Brake life is the outstanding problem at the present time. Concerted efforts are being made to obtain samples of a sintered bi-metallic lining material. Initial R & D tests of similar materials showed tremendous improvement.

The future program includes continued endurance and function testing to pick out the weak spots and high speed pictures to isolate needed design changes. Trips to the field on complaints have been made. More are planned as they become designable.
