This two-piece Adapter Sleeve for the proposed Marine Corps gun will require new forming dies and tooling for secondary operations at Ilion. It is probable that tooling for the secondary operations can be obtained by the time blanks are available.

An order for August shipment was received for sixteen (16) Model 7180 (Model 1100) shotguns from the USN Ammunition Depot. The guns will vary from the design in that the Receivers will have Model 1100 panel marking, Remington Recoil Pad and the Barrels will be 20" full choke. Parts for approximately twenty-five (25) guns have been processed. Tooling where available was used to produce parts. Some toolroom operations were required. Assembly has started and a gun was reviewed at the Operations Committee. Shipment should be made in August as scheduled.

Committee Action:

The Plant is to review the Bayonet Conversion Kit costs to enable Marketing to establish a selling price. Estimated selling prices were presented at the February 1968 meeting.

28-410 GAUGE MODEL 870 MODEL 1100, 20-28-410 GAUGE

R & D reperted that four (4) model guns are in Bridgeport. These were tested at Lordship by the Regional Managers. The results were very satisfactory. R & D is assembling four (4) model guns for each region. Shipment should be made by the end of August. Marketing requested to be advised when guns are completed. Partial shipments may be requested.

Design testing indicates an average of 1% malfunctions using Remington ammunition. Due largely to dimensional problems, gun performance is not as satisfactory when tested with competitive ammunition. Marketing will review the approach to be taken with General Management in informing competition of the ammunition problem.
