MODEL 540X, 541X and 40XB RIFLES

Anticipating that bids for ROTC target rifles may be forthcoming in the second quarter of 1969, it was decided that a pre-bid showing of Models 540X and 541X might work to our advantage. This was done by N. S. Wilson and R. M. Adams at Rock Island on December 5, 1968.

Because principal WDCOM interest centered on the 540X (but with deep regrets that it was not available with clip magazine), a meeting was held on January 30, 1969 to determine what, if any, course of action might be taken to salvage the target rifle business we had enjoyed prior to 1968. The following were in attendance:

Agreement was reached that capability and cost of producing a 540X with 6-shot clip magazine be investigated by F. E. Morgan - based on an estimated minimum procurement of 3,000 rifles.

Assuming capability and reasonable cost, it was further agreed that a minimum of 4 test samples be made - these to be offered to the Army for test concurrently with 541X samples.

In presenting the rifles to Rock Island, it was agreed that we make a two-step proposal...

1. The Model 541X as the finest target rifle in its class for high school ROTC - the Model 40XB for college ROTC.
