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SHOTGUNS - contd.

MODEL 870, 28-410 GAUGE MODEL 1100, 28-410 GAUGE - contd.

Model 1100, 28 and 410 gauge Receivers now being produced on the N/C machines include the cut in the top for the hardened insert.

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Marketing had requested that since white line spacers are being added to the Model 870, 12, 16 and 20 gauge guns for 1970 that spacers also be provided for the 28 and 410 gauges. A sample Stock having a Model 1100 Butt Plate Spacer and the Grip Cap Spacer being purchased for the 12, 16 and 20 gauge was approved by Marketing prior to the meeting. The factory cost to add the spacers is \$.35 per gun. Production stated the change could be made for introduction in 1970.

Committee Action:

The Committee approved the addition of the white line spacer to the Butt Plate and Grip Cap for the Model 870. Some 28 and 410 gauge guns shipped the latter part of 1969 could include the spacers.

MODEL 1100, 20 GAUGE LIGHTWEIGHT SHOTGUN (Introduction 1970)

Prototypes of a Model 1100, 20 gauge lightweight and magnum guns were on display. Some function testing has been completed on the regular gun. Endurance testing remains to be completed. The magnum versions will be tested to verify the design.

Production reported that to pilot assemble approximately fifty (50) plain Barrel 20 gauge lightweight guns, Barrels and Breech Bolts remain to be completed. It is expected that pre-pilot gons can be assembled by the Process Engineers the week of September 22. When testing is satisfactory, Production can resemble the balance of the pilot guns. This should be the first part of October.

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
