

SHOTGUNS - contd.MODEL 3200 OVER AND UNDER SHOTGUN
(Introduction June 1972)

R & D is to review a non-shooting prototype of the Model 3200, 12 gauge Over and Under shotgun with General Management at Bridgeport, July 9, 1970.

R & D believes the initial estimated product costs can be met. Approximately 50% of the parts have now been estimated by Production. The balance remain to be released by R & D or are being processed. Economics should be completed for review at the September meeting.

CENTER FIRE RIFLESMODEL 744-766 CENTER FIRE RIFLES
(Introduction 1972)

R & D reported that in the prototype Model 744 autoloading rifles, the Magazine functioned quite satisfactorily. However, design changes will be required to reduce malfunctions to less than 1% and improve the appearance of the Magazine.

While design testing has continued, prototype rifles have not been furnished the R & D Test Section for endurance testing.

R & D expects that release of model drawings to the plant so that processing can start in July.

MODEL 700 BOLT ACTION CENTER FIRE RIFLECaliber 25-06 Remington "Varmint Special"

The model drawings have been released to the plant. Tooling is being designed.
