

SHOTGUNS - contd.LAW ENFORCEMENT GUN STOCK  
(Introduction 1971)

Marketing reported in detail on the progress that has been made on the Law Enforcement Gun Stock. Their report is attached as Exhibit 1. The plant order will be rewritten to include the \$5000 fee for assignment of rights to the Stock rather than include this as a cost of \$1.00 per unit on the first 5000 units.

If this Stock is sold to other than law enforcement agencies, it could lead to poor public relations for Remington. Marketing was directed to arrange suitable agreements that would restrict sales of this Stock to law enforcement agencies only.

Committee Action:

The Operations Committee accepted the revised economics and the recommendation that the initial order be for 5000 units.

CENTER FIRE RIFLESMODEL 742-X RIFLE - AUTOLOADING CENTER FIRE  
(Introduction 1975)

R & D reported that the spring for the spring lock gas system has been computer designed and parts will be tested by the middle of November. Approximately 40% of the parts for a 7mm Remington Magnum and a 30-06 caliber prototype rifle are being fabricated in the Model Shop. These two prototypes will be ready for testing in February, 1972.

Layouts have been started for the shotgun and this work will follow the rifle by about six months. It is necessary to do this work concurrently with the center fire to achieve the objective of the "family of guns." The revised announcement date of 1975 is included in the development schedule. To achieve this schedule, seven additional designers and draftsmen will have to be assigned to this program in June or July of 1972.
