R & D reported that parts are being received. The assembly area is being prepared.

HANSEN AUTOLOADING SKEET TRAP

Marketing reported that the improved Hansen autoloading skeet trap appears to be exactly what is needed for the United States market. The new model has been lowered 2½", made very easy to elevate, and has the new brush mechanism that eliminates curl. The following changes are currently being made:

- . The center of the trap must be set back on the base 4½" in order for the throwing arm to clear the trap house.
- . The pull cord release must be shockproof and release on instant contact without being held down until the target is thrown.

Mr. Hansen will build 100 of the new skeet traps starting in July, 1972. 60 of these have been sold to Gyttopp (Sweden) with a delayed release for the European market. Arrangements have been made for one set from the first production with instant release to be shipped to Remington for test and evaluation on or before August 1, 1972.

Another model Hansen trap is being considered as a replacement for the Wonder Trap.

The Patent Attorney still believes that the Hansen Trap will infringe upon Olin patents. A license will be obtained from Olin to assure legal use of the Hansen design.
