Marketing reported that Remington should continue with plans to develop a suitable outside source of traps. The Hansen trap has good features and some problems. It appears that it will be necessary for R & D to work directly with the designer to solve the problems. It was recommended that Mr. Hansen be requested to come to the U.S.A. for this purpose.

As reported at the June meeting, a license will be obtained from Olin to assure legal use of the Hansen design.

Committee Action:

The Operations Committee accepted the recommendation to make arrangements with Mr. Hansen to visit the U.S.A. and work with R & D to solve the problems on his trap.

NORMA TRAP

R & D reported that parts to put the Norma trap in operating condition have not arrived. Two motors and a new base to hold the motors have been shipped. Evaluation of this trap will be completed after the new parts are received.
