I. Use of solid wood

- A. Alternative source of walnut (Purchasing)
 - 1. Domestic preferred
 - 2. Foreign
 - 3. Veneer logs

- B. Substitute for walnut (Purchasing-PE&C)
 - 1. Domestic preferred
 - a. Birch, sycamore, maple
 - b. Elm, hackberry, sweet gum, tupelo
 - c. Redwood
 - d. Others considered but not practical such as cherry, poplar, hickory (pecan), oak, alder, ash, beech

- 2. Foreign
 - a. Mahogany - considered best substitute
 - b. Danta
 - c. Imbuoia
 - d. Others - Munson report

C. Better salvage procedures

II. Use of solid laminates - (Purchasing & PE & C)
Variety of size and direction

- A. Walnut -
 - 1. Dimensioned wood
 - 2. Scrap from other processes

- B. Multiple wood -
 - 1. Example M/600 laminated Stock
 - 2. Plus factor in long Stocks

- C. Fine laminates -
 - 1. Target guns
 - 2. Disguised grain for inexpensive line

III. Substitute Processes (Wood)

- A. Laminated shells - wood R & D
- B. Laminated metal and wood R & D
- C. Segmented Stocks and Fore-ends R & D
 - 1. Wood - metal
 - 2. Wood - plastic
