<u>Priority Category</u>			
I. Necessity			These programs which are required to meet mandated regulations (CEMA), company policy, safety, product liability needs, contractual commitments, and similar non-discretionary commitments. By definition, these programs are fully funded and supported.
II. Commitments			Those programs which have been initiated in response to marketing and manufacturing needs to improve Established Businesses, and have negotiated support of Management.
III. New Initiatives			Those program proposals which are under study (or which we plan to study), to explore feasibility, justification, and to develop proposals requesting Management support. (Marketing requests for new products are automatically placed in this category.)
