

November 29, 1971

The Committee met Monday, November 29, 1971, from 3:00 to 4:12 p.m., to review the recall program to date. 51,250 rounds of all codes are being held at distributor level and 12,540 held at dealer level. 66,500 are, as yet, unaccounted for.

Bridgeport has received the following amounts.



Guns reported damaged are; six Model 760's; one Model 700 ADL; one Savage Model 110, L.H.; and one Parker-Hale. There remains the possibility of three or four additional damaged guns. No injuries have been reported.

One gun (the Savage Model 110, L.H.) was reported as using code LU30W. This is the only instance to date of any problem involving that code and it is not known whether the cartridges in use contained any #4198 powder. The possibility exists that the damage could have been due to some other cause. We may know more about this when the gun is received and examined in Bridgeport.

Quality Control reported pulling down 40 rounds of code LU30W with no contamination so far. This operation will continue.
