

30-06 CALIBER RIFLE CARTRIDGE

Gary Steel, a gunsmith from Black River, Wisconsin, reported that when sighting in a rifle, the bullet lodged in the barrel on approximately the fourth shot. He was unable to remove the bullet. The Lonoke loading code was LX 15DD. It was packaged in August 1972. He is returning the gun and ammunition to Remington.

A second customer in Black River reported he had a bullet lodge in the barrel when he fired his rifle while hunting. The Lonoke code was FLT 25DE, packaged in June 1971. Remington has requested the gun and remaining rounds to be returned.


Richard Terrones of Beloit, Wisconsin, Reported a bullet lodged in the barrel of his rifle while he was sighting in. It cost him \$35.00 to have the bullet removed. The remaining rounds of the unknown code are being returned.

Lonoke has received a complaint from Macon, Georgia, of a bullet lodged in a rifle barrel from code LU 14W, which Lonoke loaded in August 1971. There were four boxes sold; three boxes were returned to Remington. Two boxes disclosed no defects, and in the third box, three cartridges did not contain powder.

Lonoke has a second complaint of a bullet lodged in the barrel, but no details are available now. The incident is being followed.

The next meeting will be held at the call of the Chairman when further information has been received and evaluated.
